**Blended f2f/online Level 3 Certificate in Community Interpreting**

<p><b>Is this course accredited?</b></p>	<p>This blended face to face/online course is accredited by <a href="#">Ascentis</a> and the certificate is awarded upon successfully complying with all requirements and criteria.</p>
<p><b>Who is this course for?</b></p>	<p>This blended F2F/online course is suitable for candidates who already have some volunteering or paid interpreting experience and would like to gain a qualification that will award them licence to practice as a professional interpreter</p>
<p><b>When does the course run?</b></p>	<p><b>The course takes place on a roll on-roll off basis over 12 weeks:</b> Enrolment is open all year, the launch date is <b>30/04/18</b> but commencement will depend on availability to attend the face to face sessions available</p>
<p><b>Am I ready to start this course?</b></p>	<p>Before the course begins, you will take part in an <b>initial assessment task</b> to ensure you are at the appropriate level.</p>
<p><b>What do I need?</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A high level of fluency in English (oral and written – minimum ESOL level 2, C1 CEF or equivalent)</li> <li>• A high level of fluency and good writing skills in your community language</li> <li>• Some interpreting experience (voluntary or paid)</li> <li>• Knowledge of the UK public service providers</li> <li>• Ability to conduct autonomous study (research and weekly assignments) and reflect on your learning by completing a learning journal</li> <li>• ICT skills as all work will be submitted via our online platform and the course portfolio will be an E-Portfolio</li> <li>• Ability to attend 8 2h evening face to face sessions as well as completing all the tasks set in a timely manner</li> </ul>

<p><b>What will I learn?</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• You will research and discuss Health and Housing assignments</li> <li>• You will practice interpreting skills doing consecutive interpreting and sight translations</li> <li>• You will be able to assess your own work</li> <li>• You will define and explain the Public Service system in the UK, as well as the role of the community interpreter</li> <li>• You will identify and resolve ethical issues and dilemmas</li> <li>• You will be able to research and build your own Public Service setting based glossaries</li> </ul>
<p><b>What will I receive during the course?</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Access to our Students Area – our course platform that enables you to access all the course materials and submit all your coursework online</li> <li>• A dedicated qualified and experienced tutor in your language will assess your work and provide guidance on a regular basis</li> <li>• 16 face to face contact hours with your tutor and fellow learners covering course topics and interpreting practice. Class times are fixed for the 12-week period, as these are not one-to-one but group sessions. If you miss one you will have to attend the next available session to be able to complete</li> <li>• Role play practice, sight translation, research and case studies discussion in class.</li> </ul>
<p><b>What will it cost?</b></p>	<p><b>£695 (including non-refundable deposit, practical assessment and certification)</b> There is an Advance learner Loan available to cover the course fee once the deposit has been paid. <b>You will have to be accepted on the course before you can apply for this loan</b></p>
<p><b>Certification</b></p>	<p>The Ascentis Community Interpreting Level 3 Certificate is awarded upon the successful completion of the course portfolio and a minimum 90% attendance.</p>
